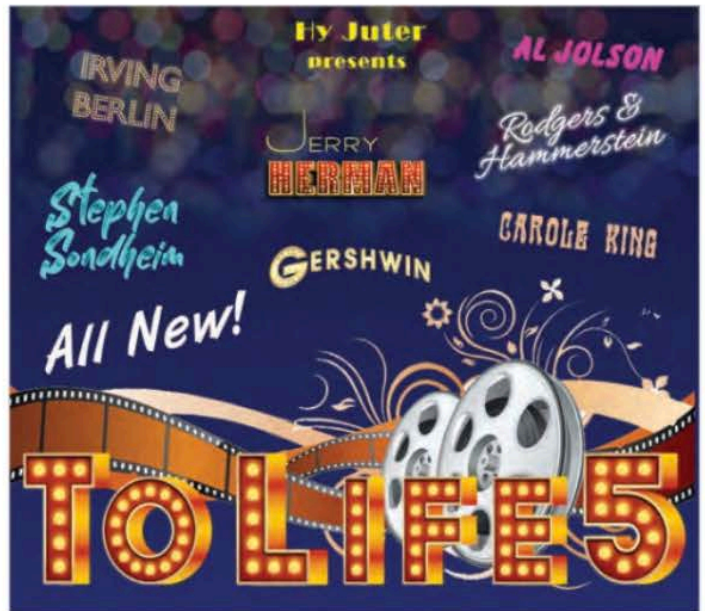
Forget Festival and Carmel Bach Festival, as well as returns Car-amoor Festival and Philadelphia Chamber Music Society, among many more.
